Rudolf Carnap and the Collected Works of Rudolf Carnap

Rudolf Carnap (1891-1970) was one of the leading philosophers of the 20th Century. After studying physics and philosophy in Germany, Carnap taught philosophy in Vienna, Prague, at the University of Chicago and UCLA. His contributions to philosophy of science, semantics, logic and probability theory helped define the major philosophical problems of the 20th Century and set unprecedented standards for approaching them with clarity and rigor.

Recent scholarship in philosophy and intellectual history has shown that Carnap was a much more imaginative, subtle, and culturally engaged philosopher than his critics knew. As the first complete edition of Carnap's published writings, the *Collected Works of Rudolf Carnap* will help preserve and focus this ongoing reappraisal. Its 13 volumes will include critical introductions, explanatory notes and, in some cases, new translations by leading philosophers. The *Collected Works of Rudolf Carnap* will present definitive and complete editions of all Carnap's published writings, spanning half a century.
